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Why are BIDs supposed to affect crime and fear of crime?

- General improvements to the physical environment and enhanced public area maintenance \rightarrow signals social control \rightarrow less attractive to potential offenders.
- Increased formal and informal social control → more "eyes on the streets"
- Increased cohesion and common goals.

However...A BID might facilitate crime by being busy places attracting a lot of different people and in turn increasing the chance of motivated offenders and suitable targets to coincide in space and time.



What do we know from pevious (US) research?

- The effect of BIDs on crime are inconclusive
 - Depending on type of crime
 - Depending on type of data
 - Depending on time-frame
- And what about fear of crime...?



When are BIDs successful?

Positive effects (in relation to crime) are found in BIDs ...

- Where there have been a general economic development (gentrification).
- With economic resources and that invested heavily in crime prevention (e.g. by hiring private security or focusing on keeping the streets clean and safe).

Aim

To assess the effects and describe experience of BID in a Swedish context

Focus on

- Social/physical disorder and crime
- Fear of crime
- Experiences of property owners





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Development in relation to crime and fear of crime

Summary of findings

- Decrease in social and physical disorder.
- Decrease in self reported victimisation.
- Mixed results regarding police recorded crimes –e.g. a decrease in property crime, violent crime remained unchanged and drug related offences increased.
- More residents feeling safe when they were out by them self in the neighbourhood late at night.



Development in relation to crime and fear of crime

Summary of findings (cont.)

- Overall positive experiences of the property owners.
- High level of trust among members, and among and representatives from local authorities.
- Improved relations between different property owners and between property owners and local authorities.



Conclusions

- Findings indicate a overall positive shift in the neighbourhood, but there is a need to...
- ...follow the development over a longer time period.
- ...to investigate the crime preventive activities that have been implemented –
 what have been done and why? Single activities that make a difference or the
 overall investment?
